 In the Roman times the Romans ate for bread, fish, bread, water or wine and for the had both ham or beef.



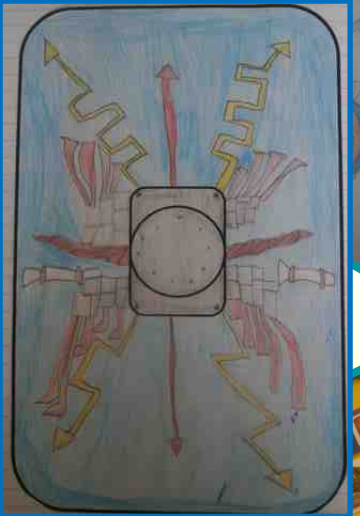
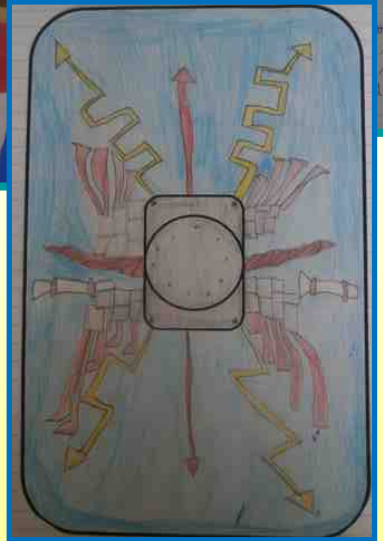

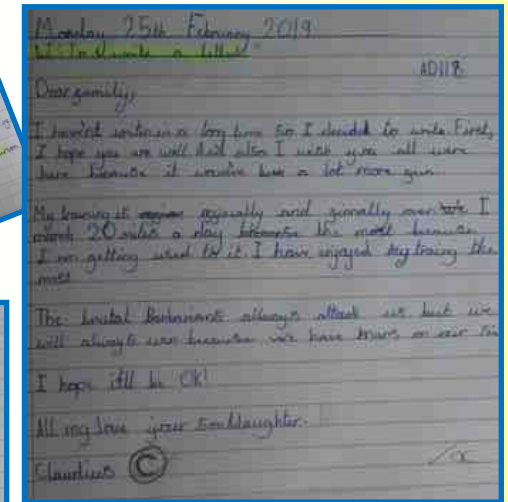
Entertainment

We imagined what it would be like to be a Roman legionary and wrote a letter home.



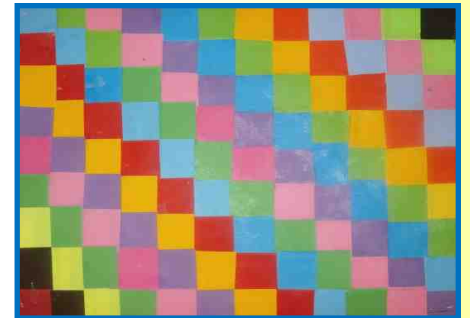
We also designed our own shields. The Romans often had lightning bolts on their shields to represent Mars.
