# What we are learning this term:





#### Maths



In Maths, we will be covering place value and the four

Operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division).

Children practise their arithmetic skills daily with end of week assessments.

Children will become secure with their place value and will be able to read and write numbers to 10 million.



Writing

Children will start the term by writing a narrative which

includes a mysterious character. We will focus on using techniques which

create mystery within a text. In the next unit, children will write an explanation text on an extreme weather, this is linked to their geography topic.

In addition, we will teach SPAG, specifically words classes and punctuation.



# Reading

We have started this term with 'The Graveyard book.' This is a gripping novel which keeps the children guessing. Our focus is on developing fluency and inference skills with a focus on developing vocabulary. We will also look at a range of shorter extracts with a focus on reading skills such as retrieval and understanding vocabulary.



#### Science:

Science is the process of learning about the natural world through observation and experimentation.

This term we will learn about living things and their habitat as well as evolution and inheritance.



## History:

History is the study of the past.

This term in history we will be learning about propaganda where we will look at the past to determine 'fake news.'



# Geography:

Geography is the study of places, people and their environments.

This term in geography we will be learning about extreme weather conditions through our topic 'Extreme Earth.'





This term in the STEM lab, we will be using CAD and textiles.





In art, we will be looking at visual literacy. We will also create our own 3D packaging.



# Computing:

In computing, we are going to be learning about how data is transferred over the internet.



# PE:

In PE, we will be focussing on team sports with the aim of developing our teamwork.



#### Music:

Our music topic this term is around singing and music appreciation with the song 'Happy.'



# RE:

This term in RE we are learning about beliefs in actions.



#### **Personal Development:**

Our topic this term is relationships where we will look at a variety of books exploring this theme. We will look at how to challenge racism as well as how to respectively disagree with differing views.



# Oracy:

In oracy this term we will focus on using appropriate sentence stems across the curriculum when speaking as well as using correct body language and eye contact when communicating.
